## LS Lowry 'Playground' – Drawing

### Prior Learning:

- Drawing skills developed throughout Reception & Y1
- This includes portraits in Y1 (Picasso) and observational drawings of flowers in Reception.

**Final Outcome:** Create a playground drawing based on Worden Park in the style of LS Lowry

To make a drawing, an artist puts lines on paper or another surface. Most artists start out by learning to draw.</p> <p>Children will be able to tell you that drawing with different media will give different effects e.g. the difference between a thick / thin drawing pencil.</p> <p>Children will know that different scales are used to represent objects further away.</p>

**Drawing**

- Experiment with confidence in different mark-making with a variety of media e.g. pencils, rubbers, crayons and charcoal
- Show increased control when making marks with a range of media.
- Name, match and draw lines/marks from observations.
- Draw lines of different shapes and thicknesses and select from different grades of pencil.
- Investigate tone by drawing light/dark lines, light/dark patterns, light/dark shapes.
