These are called Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Europe and Australia. </p> <p> Oceans are large bodies of salt water. </p> <p> There are five Oceans. These are called Pacific, Atlantic, Southern, Arctic and Indian. </p> <p> People are polluting the oceans through plastic waste. This impacts on the animals that live in the oceans. It could be reduced by using alternatives to plastic. </p> <p> <u>Extended Knowledge</u> Henderson Island is the worlds most plastic polluted beach. </p>
