Days of the week, height, length, one more, one less, numbers 0-10, add, subtract, number bonds, odd, even, counting in 2s

Practice counting to 10

Practice counting backwards from 10

Practice saying the number that is one more

Practice saying the number that is one less

Practice writing your numbers to 10 – make sure that all the numbers are the right way round!

Practice saying the days of the week. Can you ask questions such as what day is it tomorrow? What day was it yesterday?
